DIRECTOR'S NOTE

John Kander and Fred Ebb's Chicago is an enduring musical masterpiece for good reason. While the 1975 premiere's depiction of the excesses of the Roaring 20s may have been a bit too satirical or subversive for its own era, the 1996 Broadway revival hit the sweet-spot of the "celebrity criminal" in American culture. It is still playing to this very day, as both the longest-running American musical and the longest-running revival ever. Its mix of social satire, memorable songs, and iconic dance (courtesy of Bob Fosse) rightly make it one of the most recognisable and beloved modern musicals.

But what the sexy, stripped-down revival and the stunning 2002 movie adaptation minimized is that this was originally Chicago: A Musical VAUDEVILLE. The epitome of early 20c American entertainment, vaudeville celebrated both talent and oddity, presenting 10-15 unrelated specialty acts on an ever-rotating bill. In vaudeville (as in the Jazz Age), anything goes so long as you keep your audience entertained: magic, acrobatics, comedy, song, dance, animal acts, juggling, circus acts, burlesque, drag, ventriloquism, show girls, sister acts, marksmen, feats of strength and skill, even "bad" acts. Vaudeville welcomed it all!

Kander and Ebb envisioned (and titled) their musical as a collection of vaudeville acts, based upon well-



known stars of the 1920s, and complete with an emcee to announce the diverse entertainments. So we're leaning into the wonderful world of vaudeville in our own production, celebrating its stars and its style for Taieri Musical's rendition of this iconic show. With a salacious, satirical, true-crime story to link its show-stopping numbers, Chicago feels as fresh and timely as it ever has. And in a world of reality entertainment, immediate gratification, and questionable celebrities, we still can't help but agree that "(s)he had it comin'!"

ABOUT THE SHOW

Jazz, liquor, and murder.

Welcome to the trial of the century. Based on real-life events, Chicago follows the story of wannabe vaudeville dancer Roxie Hart whose hidden affair results in the murder of her lover. After convincing her husband Amos and the rest of the city to believe her extravagant lies she turns murder into fame. Whilst in prison at the infamous Cook County Jail, Roxie meets her hero, double murderess and night club sensation Velma Kelly. After both gaining Billy Flynn as their attorney, the two go head-to-head in what can only be described as a dazzling, hilarious and entertaining competition for the spotlight.


CREATIVE TEAM

Director - Kim Morgan

Kim Morgan is thrilled to return to Taieri Musical for Chicago, after having the time of her life helming That Bloody Woman in 2021 -- and picking up the OSTA Award for Best Direction. Perhaps better known as co-founder and principal director for Dunedin Summer Shakespeare (where she recently mounted A Midsummer Night's Dream, pandemic be damned!), Kim has happily found her way back to musicals and her abiding love of Kander & Ebb's dark humour.

Kim is an award-winning director, author/editor, and educator who's worked in academic and professional theatre for over 25 years. She holds a PhD in Theatre (Directing, Shakespeare, History); has taught at University of Otago, University of Denver, University of Colorado, SUNY-Binghamton; and authored a monograph and several book chapters / articles on Hamlet in 20c Russia.

In America, Kim trained and/or worked at: Colorado Shakespeare Festival, Curious Theatre Co., Shakespeare & Co., Dell'Arte, Denver Center Theatre Co., Naropa, and various regional theaters. In New Zealand, Kim has lectured, performed, and directed at: University of Otago, Fortune Theatre, Otago Museum, Toitu Settlers Museum, SGCNZ, Columba College, InterAct, Otepoti Theatre Lab, Prospect Park Productions, Moose of Fire Productions, and Dunedin Fringe Festival. She has also provided leading character voices for puppetry and animated television series through NHNZ.



After 20 plus years of regular onstage appearances, Bridget made her Musical Director debut with Taieri Musical in 2005 with Chess. She has since gone on to musically direct Annie, Grease, Honk, Oliver, My Fair Lady, Buddy Holly, Jesus Christ Superstar, Les Miserables, Blood Brothers, Heathers, and one of her faves to date - That Bloody Woman. As a Teaching Fellow in Contemporary Voice and Musical Theatre Voice at the University of Otago, Bridget's love and passion for musical theatre remains a constant source of her inspiration and drive. She recently set up a new theatre and cabaret production company Pop up Productions NZ with fellow singer, performer and vocal lecturer, Arlie McCormick, which produced the successful sell out season of Heathers the Musical.

A well-known private vocal teacher, Bridget still manages to run her own private studio alongside teachers Olivia and Jess Larkins. She would like to say a heartfelt thanks to her husband Paul for his amazing support and patience, Taieri Musical for another brilliant show experience, and Kim and Emma for being such a fabulous creative team to work with. Choreographer - Emma Donaldson





Production Manager - Emma Morey



Marketing Manager - Chelsea McRae



















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
